1. This building was built in 1915 and originally housed a candy company.

2. This building was built in 1904 by a company that produces threshers (farming equipment).

3. This building was known as “Racine Harbor Lighthouse and Life Saving Station”.

4. This building was built as an English College.

5. This building was taken down and put back together in 1964-65.

6. This building was known as the “ Clock Tower Place” and a local high school is named after it.

7. This building (company) is one of the oldest family-owned businesses in the U.S.

8. This building was a school in 1890 and is now an apartment building.

9. This building was built in 1857 for the Racine and Mississippi Railroad and survived the devastating fires in Racine.

10. This building was built in memory of war victims and war battles.

11. This was built in 1884 and is 61-feet-tall and cost \$8000 to build.

12. This building was a library and now has much of our Racine History.

13. This was built in 1901 to the Chicago and Northwestern Railway.

14. This was built in 1880 and is 108-feet-tall.

15. This was built in 1923 and you can still get delicious burgers there to this day.
